# Glenville Hill Fire District Future

The present firehouse was built in 1955. At the time of its construction, the building construction was bonded for \$15,000. It has served both the Fire District and its volunteer Company well over the past 60-plus years it has been in use. Since being built, many NYS and National Fire codes have evolved. District 8 has complied with the best of its ability working within the confines of its original footprint, however, there remain several deficiencies in building that result in safety concerns.

It is time to move forward and provide a compliant, safe environment for both the District's equipment and the volunteer firefighters who serve us every day. The Fire Commissioners continue to research several Grant funding sources, including their contacting both State and Federal Legislators to help address our concerns.

District Commissioners together with volunteer Company members are in complete agreement; the District does not need, require or want an expensive brick and mortar firehouse that costs millions to construct. The goal is to firefighter safety, improve provide workable apparatus bays and create an accessible location to accommodate district residents for such things as was needed last fall when Police Chief Janik addressed residential break-ins. More information will be forthcoming as the planning process progresses.
